# Master's Course in International Cooperation and Development

## TOWARDS A PARTICIPATORY APPROACH TO GLOBALIZATION

The political, economic and social development of least developed countries is one of the major challenges of globalization. Growing interdependence and integration offer a chance to strengthen cooperative relations between the North and the South of the world. The call to cooperation is urgent: poverty, inequality, conflict, instability, and uncertainty still affect everyday life of a majority of world population.

The Master's Course in International Cooperation and Development offers a privileged framework for designing tentative solutions to the above mentioned problems through the collective action of governmental and non governmental agents, bridging gaps among people, groups and institutions.



## WHY THIS MASTER'S COURSE

This Master's program aims at converting theoretical knowledge into practical wisdom, and to give students a specific set of professional skills to successfully face the job market. This is possible thanks to these distinctive characteristics:

- the limited number of admitted students guarantees an efficient interaction with instructors and colleagues in the class;
- active participation in class includes simulations, case analysis, team assignments;
- experts and executives take an active part in the program sharing their professional experiences with the students;
- the internship is a chance to directly test skills acquired during courses.

## WHY WITH ASERI

Since 1996 ASERI has been helping young people from all over the world to develop in their international careers; many former students are currently employed in private and public cooperation agencies.

ASERI has organized many seminars and short courses on development for both professionals and young graduates, such as "Globalization and Development: actors and instruments for international cooperation", "Summer School in Peace and Democracy Building", "Governance and Public Policies" (for a group of Iraqi officials and members of the Parliament).

MIC&D is the outcome of ASERI's long and diversified experience: four editions were predominantly taught in Italian; in English since the a.y. 2010-11. In its history, this program has relied on ASERI's international network of Universities, NGOs, public and private institutions from all over the world, exchanging visions, experiences and scientific reflections with each other and with students.

## GOALS

MIC&D trains professionals to be able to contribute to development cooperation with creativity, personality and competence:


- identifying local needs through a bottom-up approach;
- managing technical, financial and administrative aspects of cooperation initiatives;
- involving civil society in identifying resources and deciding upon their use;
- collaborating with national and international institutions within the policy framework of the country where projects are implemented.

The ability to interpret local and international events, to interact with all the stakeholders, to identify and manage environmentally and local culture-friendly interventions requires both a basic multidisciplinary training and specialized technical and managerial competences.

## PLACEMENT OPPORTUNITIES

Students completing MIC&D are equipped to manage international cooperation and development projects in different sectors, consistently with their previous training and experience, within several organizations: NGOs, international institutions, public administration, private companies, etc.

Job placement of the a.y. 2007/2008 edition was 80% within 6 months from graduation.





## PARTICIPANTS PROFILE

The Master's program is designed for:

- **young graduates** with a strong interest in cooperation and development, willing to acquire interdisciplinary competences and professional tools;
- **professionals in different fields** who aspire to apply their competences to cooperation and development;
- **people with a professional background in development cooperation** who aspire to deepen and strengthen their professional training, valorising their experience and reinforcing their theoretical and applied competences.

The Master is open to students from different disciplines, in particular Political Science, Economics, Law, Humanities, Education, Foreign Languages, Psychology, Social Science, Engineering, Nursing Science, Agronomy, Environmental Science. To ensure high quality of learning and strong class interaction, the maximum number of admitted students is limited to 25.

## CURRICULUM

MIC&D is organized along four complementary levels, fostering multidimensional training and integrating scientific methodologies and operative competences.

### 1<sup>st</sup> level - Scientific training

The first level provides students of different academic backgrounds with a multidisciplinary education on various dimensions of development processes aimed at acquiring the relevant economic, political, historical, legal, institutional and managerial competences, with a special focus on fighting against poverty and fostering social inclusion.

#### Main topics covered:

- Poverty, inequality and human development
- Geopolitics of development with focus on different geographic areas (Africa, Asia, Latin America)
- Globalization and social development
- Development Economics
- Trade and financial policies for development
- Human rights
- International law and development cooperation
- Economics and management of international cooperation agencies

### 2<sup>nd</sup> level - Professional training

The second level aims at developing practical skills required to operate in the sector, including analysis of actors and strategies of cooperation, project cycle management (identification, formulation, funding, implementation and evaluation), understanding conflict and preventing it. The development of personal skills is also stressed, aimed at an efficient career management. The methodology of the second level foresees team working, workshops and role playing; professionals and experts coming from ASERI's stable partners (NGOs, international organizations, public administration, companies) are directly involved.

### 3<sup>rd</sup> level - Project work

Students are required to develop a personal research project on an issue related to development cooperation, under the supervision of a MIC&D professor and/or a professional from a partner institution.

The project work will often be connected to the internship experience.

### 4<sup>th</sup> level - Internship

The Master's program is completed by an internship within one of the ASERI partner institutions or other entities whose mission and activities are consistent with the Master's program. The internship will give students the chance to test and deepen the competences acquired during classes in a specific job context, in Italy or abroad, defined through a constant exchange between each student and the tutor, whose task is to support students in their academic and professional endeavour.

## FINAL DIPLOMA

The Master's Course (Master universitario di I livello) will be granted by the Università Cattolica del Sacro Cuore after the achievement of 60 credits gained through course attendance and the successful completion of all examinations.

## ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

In order to enrol in the Master's program applicants must:

- have completed at least a 3-year University degree;
- pass a selection based on the CV, the motivational questionnaire assessment and the interview;
- demonstrate a good knowledge of English, which is the language of instruction for the whole program.

## HOW TO APPLY

Applications will be received from April to December 3<sup>rd</sup> through an **ongoing process**. Therefore the earlier applications have more chance of being accepted. The Master's Commission will assess applications from the beginning of May and will announce their decision three weeks later.

ASERI accepts conditional admissions for students who plan to graduate by December 2010.

Applicants are required to produce the following documents:

- 1 Application form, to be completed online
- 2 Certified transcripts of grades (translated either in English or Italian language)
- 3 Resumé with photo
- 4 Motivational questionnaire

No fee is charged for the selection process.

## Important note FOR NON-EU CITIZENS

According to Italian law, Italian universities may not receive applications directly from NON-EU citizens. Therefore, they must apply via the local Italian EMBASSY or CONSULATE.

## FEES

The program fee is € 6.500,00. For students enrolling by September 30<sup>th</sup> the tuition fee will be reduced to € 5.800,00. The fee covers tuition, tutoring service, school's facilities and teaching materials. Scholarships and financial aid may become available in the course of the year.
